

Kelly G. Bacon Memorial Scholarship (\$1000)

This scholarship honors the memory of Kelly G. Bacon, a 1972 graduate of Oregon State University, and his significant accomplishments in the field of government service, particularly his commitment to upholding ethical standards.

Criteria:

- College of Liberal Arts major interested in pursuing a career in government service
- Student must be entering his/her sophomore year by Fall 2017
- Must be in good academic standing in the College of Liberal Arts and have a 2.75 GPA or higher
- Must be an Oregon resident
- Preference will be given to students who have a record of volunteer and/or paid experience in community service activities

A complete application packet includes:

1. Kelly G. Bacon Memorial Scholarship Application.
2. A cover letter specifically addressing your goals as they relate to the qualifications for this scholarship and why you would be an excellent recipient of this award.
3. A current resume.
5. Two (2) letters of recommendation

Dean's Scholarship (\$4000)

This scholarship is made possible by two OSU alumni who received their Bachelor's degrees in 1980. They were married during spring break of their senior year and have gone on to great professional success. This scholarship recognizes academic achievement of a student in the top ten percent of their class.

Criteria:

- College of Liberal Arts majors with a cumulative 3.75 GPA or higher
- Involvement in co-curricular activities during college
- Plan to graduate by June 2018

A complete application packet includes:

1. Dean's Scholarship Application.
2. A two (2) page essay explaining your co-curricular activities as part of your liberal arts education; how your education has helped to define your post-graduation goals, and how your education will help you achieve your goals.

3. A chart of co-curricular activities you have participated in since beginning your college career (see example/instructions for more details).
4. Any additional information you consider pertinent to the award committee.
5. Three (3) letters of recommendation from OSU faculty and/or classroom teachers who can attest to your outstanding academic performance.

Tom & Pat Gallagher Scholarship (\$1000)

This scholarship was funded with the generous donations of Thomas L. Gallagher, Jr., and Patricia A. Gallagher. Graduates of Oregon State University, the Gallaghers believe in the value of a liberal arts education and are committed to encouraging students in pursuing liberal arts educations.

Criteria:

- Student must be enrolled as undergraduate, sophomore or higher standing, majoring in the College of Liberal Arts
- Must be in good academic standing and have a 3.25 GPA or higher
- Student must have graduated from an Oregon public high school
- Financial need will be considered in the decision process

A complete application packet includes:

1. Tom & Pat Gallagher Scholarship Application.
2. A two (2) page essay describing why you are pursuing a liberal arts education.
3. A completed financial worksheet (included).
4. Two (2) letters of reference from OSU faculty and/or classroom teachers who can attest to your outstanding academic performance.

David Morgan Kiekel Memorial Scholarship (\$1500)

This scholarship honors the memory of David Morgan Kiekel, a Corvallis native and OSU alumni. The award, given by his family and friends, reflects David's interests in travel, Latino culture, and his kindness to new people. This scholarship is awarded to a student pursuing an International Degree along with his/her primary degree.

Criteria:

- Students must be enrolled as undergraduates, majoring in both the College of Liberal Arts and an International Degree
- Must be in good academic standing and have an OSU GPA of 2.75 or higher

- Financial need will be considered in the decision process

A complete application packet includes:

1. David Morgan Kiekel Memorial Scholarship Application.
2. A two (2) page essay explaining the ways in which the international component of your degree enhances your liberal arts education.
3. A completed financial worksheet (included).
4. Any additional information you consider pertinent to the award committee.
5. Two (2) letters of reference from OSU faculty and/or classroom teachers who can attest to your outstanding academic performance.

Genevieve Andrews Pershke Scholarship (\$1000)

This scholarship honors Genevieve Andrews Pershke, who was born in 1923. She attended college and was one of the first people in North Dakota to obtain a teacher's license. This scholarship reflects her lifelong interest in learning.

Criteria:

- Students must be enrolled as undergraduates in the College of Liberal Arts with the intent to study Elementary Education
- Preference will be given to students with a cumulative 3.0 GPA and at least one classroom experience
- Financial need will be considered in the decision process

A complete application packet includes:

1. College of Liberal Arts Scholarship Application.
2. A two (2) page essay describing: an issue you see impacting elementary education today OR your plans for professional development once you have your own classroom.
3. A one (1) page detailed list of your classroom experience(s), if any. Not required if you don't have any classroom experience.
4. A completed financial worksheet.
5. Two (2) letters of reference from OSU faculty and/or classroom teachers who can attest to your outstanding academic performance.

Florence Gradon Ragen and Louis Brooks Ragen Scholarship (\$1500)

This scholarship honors Florence Gradon Ragen and Louis Brooks Ragen, individuals dedicated to the value of a liberal arts education. The scholarship is provided by their children, to recognize the exceptional leadership abilities and strong academic achievement of an undergraduate student in the College of Liberal Arts.

Criteria:

- Must be an undergraduate student with a College of Liberal Arts major while receiving the scholarship
- Have a cumulative 3.5 GPA or higher
- Must be able to demonstrate leadership abilities
- Must be a graduate of an Oregon high school

A complete application packet includes:

1. College of Liberal Arts Scholarship Application.
2. A two (2) page essay in which you: define leadership, and explain the role of a liberal arts education in good leadership.
3. A chart of co-curricular activities you have participated in since beginning your college career (see included sample for format).
4. Any additional information you consider pertinent to the award committee.
5. Two (2) letters of reference from OSU faculty and/or classroom teachers who can attest to your outstanding academic performance.

Lisa Taubman Scholarship (\$2000)

This scholarship honors Lisa Taubman, who taught in the Psychology Department at OSU from 1955 until her retirement in 1986. She was active in departmental and university affairs. She developed and taught the first Psychology of Women classes at OSU. Lisa Taubman was student-oriented and her “open door” policy was very much appreciated by her students.

Criteria:

- Students must be enrolled as full-time undergraduates with a College of Liberal Arts major
- Must be a sophomore, junior or senior while receiving the scholarship
- Must have a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher
- Preference will be given to female students from small Oregon towns (population under 10,000)
- Financial need will be considered in the decision process

A complete application packet includes:

1. College of Liberal Arts Scholarship Application.
2. A two (2) page essay describing how your liberal arts education has affected your view of yourself in relation to the community in which you were raised and the community you plan to enter after graduation.

3. A completed financial worksheet (included).
4. Any additional information you consider pertinent to the award committee.
5. One (1) letter of reference.

William Q. Wick Scholarship (\$1000)

This scholarship honors the memory of William Q. Wick, Sea Grant College Program Director from 1973 to 1990. Although a scientist by training, William Q. Wick understood the value of a liberal arts education at this university and in the wider community. This scholarship benefits deserving students working toward undergraduate degrees within the College of Liberal Arts at Oregon State University.

Criteria:

- Students must be enrolled as full-time undergraduate students in the College of Liberal Arts, in good academic standing at the time of application.
- Must be able to demonstrate leadership abilities and participation in co-curricular activities (high school and college).
- Preference will be given to Oregon high school graduates and residents.

A complete application packet includes:

1. College of Liberal Arts Scholarship Application.
2. A one (1) page essay describing your leadership abilities and experiences.
3. A chart of co-curricular activities you have participated in during high school and college (included example and instructions).
4. Two (2) letters of reference from OSU faculty and community members who can attest to your outstanding academic performance.
5. Two (2) letters of reference from OSU faculty and community members who can attest to your outstanding academic performance.
