Specific requirements for acceptance into the Professional Graphic Design program

To apply and be considered for admission, all preprofessional students must meet the following requirements:

- Be declared as a Pre-Graphic Design major.
- Have completed and received a C- or better in ALL pre-requisite courses within the Pre-Graphic Design major by the end of spring term before applying.

Criteria for acceptance:

Students will be evaluated on the following:

- · Completion and grade in GD 126.
- Completion and grades in GD Foundation courses: ART 101, ART 115, ART 121, and ART 131.
- Completion and grades in Bacc Core First-Year Skills Requirements: WR 121Z, Speech course (choose one: COMM 111Z COMM 114, or COMM 218Z) and College Level Math course: MTH 105Z or higher.
- Overall GPA.

- A minimum of 180 credits are required for graduation; 60 must be upper division (300 and 400-level courses).
- A maximum of 135 credits earned at a community college may be applied toward a bachelor's degree at OSU.
- Only courses with letter prefixes and numbers above 100 can be accepted.
- Some courses can count towards your major and the Baccalaureate Core. Check with your advisor.
- Options available. See "Important Notes".

- It is important to speak with your OSU advisor early on, and often, to ensure correct course selection and sequencing.

- Students do not have to complete a transfer degree in order to transfer to OSU.
 - o If you've completed the Oregon AAOT, all requirements of the Baccalaureate Core are complete except for Synthesis Courses and Writing Intensive Courses.
