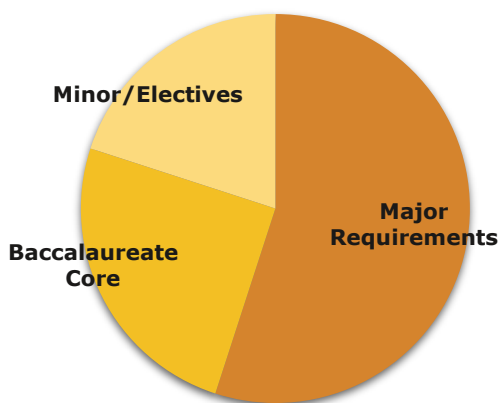

Public Policy

Public policy is a discipline that seeks evidence-based solutions to the complex issues impacting our communities, such as climate change, student debt, mass incarceration, immigration, and more. The major takes an interdisciplinary approach that draws primarily from political science, economics, and sociology. With required specialization in Environmental Policy, Rural Policy, or Social Policy, this major prepares students for careers in the government, nonprofit, or private sectors, as well as graduate studies.

Government is the primary vehicle for creating public policy, but policy decisions are influenced by many actors outside of government, which provides students with a variety of career options. Examples include policy researchers and analysts, legislators or legislative aides, community organizers, public program administrators, lobbyists, consultants, lawyers and paralegals, social services administrators, and more.

Your Bachelor's Degree (BS) in the College of Liberal Arts



- A minimum of 180 credits are required for graduation; 60 must be upper division (300 and 400-level courses).
- A maximum of 124 credits earned at a community college may be applied toward a bachelor's degree at OSU.
- Only courses with letter prefixes and numbers above 100 can be accepted.
- Some courses can count towards your major and the Bacalaureate Core. Check with your advisor.
- Options available. See "Important Notes".

Important Notes for the College and Major:

- Grade requirements can vary; refer to your OSU advisor.

- Other similar majors to explore: Political Science, Sociology, Economics
- PS 201, SOC 204, ECON 201, and some Baccalaureate Core are priority courses to complete before transferring to OSU.
- Talk with an OSU advisor about your specific timeline for the best time to transfer.
- It is important to speak with your OSU advisor early on, and often, to ensure correct course selection and sequencing.

Resources and OSU Information:

- Students do not have to complete a transfer degree in order to transfer to OSU.
 - If you've completed the Oregon AAOT, all requirements of the Baccalaureate Core are complete except for Synthesis Courses and Writing Intensive Courses.
