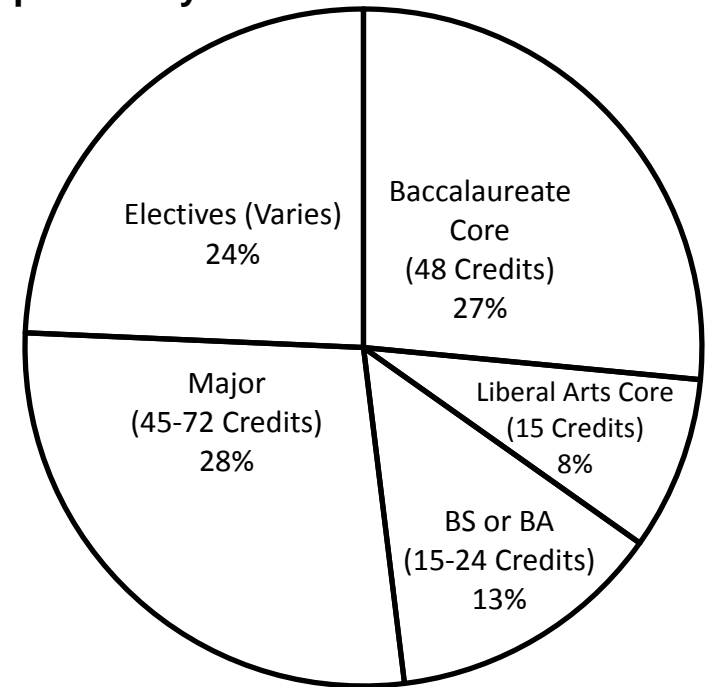

B.S. 15 hours in science, computer science and quantitative studies 1. _____ 2. _____ 3. _____ _____	<p>The CLA B.S. degree requirement is a minimum 15-credit block of science, computer science, and quantitative studies as follows:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Any Computer Science (CS) course approved by the student's major department (3-4 credits), and Any course from the College of Science approved by the student's major department except math or statistics (3-4 credits), and One of the following (8 - 12 credits): <ul style="list-style-type: none"> A. ST 351 and ST 352 (8). B. MTH 111 and MTH 245 (4, 4). C. Any 8 credits of MTH courses at the 200 level or above (not including MTH 211 and MTH 212). D. MTH 211, MTH 212, or MTH 390 (4, 4). Pre-elementary education majors only. E. MTH 241, MTH 245 or MTH 251, and ST 351 (8 credits). <p>Many departments require specific courses to satisfy the BS degree requirements; students should consult their academic advisors for details. Courses used to satisfy the BS degree requirements may not also be used to satisfy baccalaureate core requirements.</p>

IMPORTANT NOTES:

 - Minor courses are the only exception. They can be used for minor requirements and core.

Withdraw: You may withdraw from a maximum of 12 individual classes from OSU.
S/U: You may only use a maximum of 36 satisfactory credits toward your degree. You cannot S/U courses in your major.
PAC: Physical Activity Courses maximum is 11 credits.
ALS: Academic Learning Services maximum is 15 credits.
MUP: Music (Studio) maximum is 12 credits.
RESIDENCY: 45 of the last 75 credits or 150 total credits must be completed while the student is in academic residence at OSU.

GRADUATION IS NOT AUTOMATIC!!!

Check when completed:

- () Baccalaureate Core completed
- () College of Liberal Arts Core completed including requirements for the BA or BS
- () Departmental requirements completed and major G.P.A. met and approved by departmental adviser
- () A minimum of 180 total credits
- () A minimum of 60 Upper Division credits (as part of the total of the 180 credits)
- () Academic Residency: 45 of the last 75 or 150 total credits must be completed while the student is in academic residence at OSU
- () Students must achieve a minimum cumulative OSU G.P.A. of 2.00
- () You must apply for graduation through student online services at least two terms prior to your desired graduation date
