Unlike last year, this is an early notice. Applications for \$6,000 NEH summer research stipends for summer 2012 are due at the NEH by September 29. OSU can nominate two faculty and will accept applications (a paper version of the application you would submit online, if nominated) until September 1. Here is the process:

1. Consult the national website and get the proper application information:

<http://www.neh.gov/grants/guidelines/stipends.html>

2. Submit a paper version of your application and a 2-3 page vita to the College of Liberal Arts (Gilkey 207) by September 1. Note: Although you need two letters of recommendation for a national nomination, you DO NOT need to have the letters for the local, OSU portion of the selection process. You only need to supply the NAMES of your recommenders for your OSU nomination.

3. Per NEH regulations, the OSU college committee will select one junior nominee and one senior nominee to be submitted to the national competition. Those nominees will be notified by September 12.

4. The two nominees will need to submit their respective applications ONLINE (same website as in #1) by September 29 (no exceptions--the website won't receive late applications).

Nominees will need to ensure that their letters of recommendation are also received by this time.
